OPENING

- 1. Chalice lighting/opening words Hackley read the poem Invocation by Everett Hoagland (from Ghost Fishing)
- 2. Check-in: Participants shared a time in which they leaned into an uncomfortable situation.
- 3. Affirmation of covenant, mission and vision
 - <u>COVENANT</u>: We convene, bringing our best selves prepared, listening and open as we work together to further the Mission and Vision of People's Church.

- 6. Financials Review
 - a. Lewis noted reserve fund in October Finance Committee report needs to be assessed as regards plans for replacement cycles of roof, etc.
 - Hunt reported: contribution shortfall problem is over (up about \$10K in October); contributions and collections are 219% of budget; office expenditures + B & G + custodial expenses are over budget due to talented staff.
 - c. Investments Feldmeier reported Sept 30 end-of-quarter highlights:
 - i. \$625K started year, funds at \$537K due to decline in market which is starting to rebound
 - ii. Estimate from endowment funds in year end distribution is approximately \$25K
 - iii. We are debt free! \$950K for the new addition paid in full in 10 years (2022 last installment paid). This is a remarkable achievement.
 - iv. Memorial Garden Fund balance = \$8,600. Rev. Rachel requested investment committee and representative from Memorial Garden committee meet to resolve donor concern.
 - v. Recommend consideration be given to financial planning classes / educational programs re: planned giving. Rev. Rachel will follow up.
 - vi. Recommend investment policy review after bylaws are finalized.
 - vii. Vote: New committee member Pat VanSlambrouck for 3 year term. Unanimous approval.
- 7. Staff reports Rev. Rachel noted when it's time to call a new minister, the 2 week voting period noted in the policy created last spring needs to be shortened as it is a hardship to wait for this time period.

PLANNING FOR THE FUTURE

- 8. Policies under revision
 - a. Board Lewis, Hampel, Bair Lewis will edit notes and submit for December meeting.

- b. Safety Bolar, Bair, Hackley Bolar reported team met 10/21 and in info gathering phase of year-long effort. Will assess strengths/weaknesses, identify resources needed. Heckman will arrange for public safety/fire likely in early 2023. Team will follow up with Carrier Church Mutual Insurance.
- c. Other M. Johnson Rev. Rachel will contact M. Johnson for history of our policy on social justice
- 9. Getting ready for May, 2023 Annual Meeting
 - a. Article III Rev. Rachel will connect with team (Friedel, McClurkan, Hackley) to plan follow up with ~12 folks that strongly opposed adoption of bylaws language
 - b. Per governance calendar:
 - i. March board meeting budget approval and any policy work that can be completed
 - ii. March 5 tentative stewardship kick off
 - iii. May 21 annual congregational meeting
 - iv. May 9 deadline for notifying congregation about annual meeting
